RECENT ERYC PLANNING DECISIONS FOR SOUTH CAVE

(i) DC/11/03991/PLF – Erection of single storey extension to rear at 27 Church Street, South Cave – Approved
The Parish Council raised no objection to this application.

(ii) DC/11/04113/PAD – Display of free standing ‘V’ shaped directional sign at junction A1034 and B1230 to serve Farm shop and Tea Room at Land North of Kettlethorpe Hill, South Cave – Refused
The Parish Council raised no objection to this application.

(iii) 11/03740/PLF – Erection of a detached garage following demolition of existing garage at 6 Middle Garth Drive, South Cave – Approved
The Parish Council raised no objection to this application.

(iv) 11/05446/PLF – Construction of raised platform to the west elevation and alterations to existing openings (AMENDED DESCRIPTION) at Partridge Cottage and Pheasant Cottage, 1 and 2 West Hill, South Cave – Approved
The Parish Council raised no objection to this application.

(v) 11/04416/PLF – Erection of 2 no. dwellings and garages, use of land for the construction of tennis courts, construction of a highway turning facility and the provision of car parking following demolition of existing building at 43 Bacchus Lane, South Cave for Mr P. Wilson – Refused
The Parish Council recommend refusal of this application.

The South Cave Parish Council is in the process of preparing a basic emergency plan, so that as a community we can help ourselves if something was to happen in our parish.

Checking on vulnerable people, collecting provisions and prescriptions, helping move property and furniture, clearing snow and providing shelter, warmth and food and drinks are the kind of things that we think we can do to help people affected by an emergency.

We are writing to ask for your help. Would you be willing to help out during an emergency? Do you have any particular skills or equipment that you think might be of use? Do you belong to a community group that might be able to help during an emergency, such as luncheon groups or crèches? For snow clearance, limited tools will be available from The Town Hall.

If the answer is yes – and you would like to do something to help your community - we would very much like to hear from you. There are no obligations on anyone who volunteers – it will just mean that we may call you in an emergency to ask if you are free to help.

We would also like to hear from you if you think you might need support during an emergency, and we will do our best to contact you in an emergency to see if you are ok.

SOUTH CAVE SOCIAL & RECREATIONAL COMMITTEE

The above committee, formed in 1949, are trustees of the land on which Bowls, Tennis, Cricket & Football are played.

The clubs organise themselves, and have representatives on the committee.

All the clubs are run by volunteers and on the whole are very successful in their particular sport.

In particular the Football Clubs (Junior and Senior) have been fortunate to build a new pavilion and increase the playing area. These new facilities are only now starting to be fully used. Use of the new playing area was delayed by the weather which affected the grass growing.

This now means that over 200 junior footballers (boys and girls) can now train and play at South Cave, when previously they would have had to play where ever they could find a field. In addition the local school children use the field for physical education.

The committee would like to thank all those who contributed in, many different ways in supporting and funding the new facilities. It has been a ten year journey, from destroyed pavilion, to caravan, onto an up to date pavilion and increase in playing area.

There is however one more problem to solve and that is "dogs". Not so much dogs themselves but what they occasionally leave behind. The committee has no wish to ban dogs from the field but appeal to dog owners to attend to any mess their dog may make. "BAG IT & BIN IT" has to be the answer. There is evidence of some owners bagging and throwing same in to the out field. **Not nice.**

We ask owners to be more responsible for their dogs. Please bear in mind with 200 youngsters, plus 30 seniors, playing football plus school children, on the field each week, if there has been a "Dog Deposit" some unfortunate individual is going to find it.

CHANGES TO BUS SERVICES

New buses for South Cave! A message from EYMS.

EYMS would like to thank all the South Cave residents who came to give their views at our bus service consultation in the village at the end of last year.

The most popular issues raised were that villagers would like the Petuaria Express Service X55 to come into South Cave to provide a faster link to Hull, and also that it would be useful to have a link to Market Weighton and York.

From Sunday 5 February EYMS will be making changes to their bus services in the area. The Petuaria Express Service X55 will now serve South Cave and North Cave on some journeys, and will also extend to Goole, and these journeys will replace many of the Service 155 journeys. The Wicstun Express will provide new fast buses to Market Weighton and York – look out for the distinctive 'Viking' buses.

There are also changes to other buses in the area, including Services 144, 151 and 153.

New timetables are available at outlets along the route, including South Cave Town Hall and Elloughton EYMS Depot. Alternatively, download the timetables from www.eyms.co.uk or ring BusCall on 01482 22 22 22 for details.

THE CLOSURE OF THE SOUTH CAVE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

At the recent Annual General Meeting of the South Cave Branch of the Royal British Legion a decision was taken to close the branch. This was brought about by the resignations of the Chairman, the Treasurer and the Secretary. There were no nominations for any of the positions and as a result a vote was taken to close the branch, the vote was unanimous in favour of the closure. The branch have been trying for a long time to recruit new members who would be willing to take a position on the committee but it was all to no avail.

Now, after 90 years, there will be no branch in the village. All the branch funds will now be placed in the County Holding Bank and after 3 years, unless the branch is reformed, will be transferred to the County Welfare Fund. It is very regrettable that the closure has taken place but branches are being closed all over the country due to lack of support in branch management. Just recently the East Yorkshire and the North Yorkshire areas have had to amalgamate because of lack of members and support.

I would like to thank everyone who has supported me in any way over the years, it was very much appreciated by myself and the branch committee.

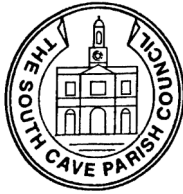
Membership of the PPG is open to those who are registered as patients of the practice. Numbers are limited to 30 but there are currently 2 places available to new members.
