From The Chairman

I am sure that most if not all of you will now be aware of the scheme for future development being produced by East Riding of Yorkshire Council under the heading "Local Development Framework". This was discussed with a representative of ERYC at the Annual Parish Meeting in May and again at our full Council Meeting in June. Your Council is currently preparing a detailed response to ERYC's proposals, which we intend to submit by the end of this month – we have been granted an extension to the time limit specified.

As part of our reply, we will include responses to the survey we conducted amongst each and every household in the village during early July. These have been analysed and are summarised below: -

We received 297 replies from the 1656 households in the village = 17.9%.

83.5% did not agree with the proposal to build 65 new houses.

70.4% did not want any new houses at all.

88.9% do not want any development outside the existing limit.

Principle concerns are – Traffic and Parking, capacity of existing facilities and the ability of the utilities to cope with any substantial increase.

If new housing has to be accommodated, then the majority would prefer it to be sited in smaller developments around the village.

Of those that completed questionnaires – 52% are no longer employed.

Of those that do travel to work – 77% travel by car.

10% use the train but they all travel to the station by car.

Over 95% conduct their main shopping outside the village and 95% of those, travel by car.

The average number of cars per household is 1.6

88% prefer any development to include affordable housing.

As stated, these views will form an important base for the Council's response to the proposals by ERYC and the detailed summary will be submitted in full.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those that took the time to respond to our questionnaire.

Finally, it is my sad duty to announce the recent death of Olive Mitchell who was a stalwart member of the community and an active Parish Councillor for many years. The Council offer our sincere condolences to her family.

Booking Appointments

You can make an appointment either by attending the surgery in person, telephoning our dedicated appointment number (see inside front cover) or online via emis access. The receptionist will ask whether your problem can be dealt with over the phone (telephone consultation) or whether you need to see a GP (ie the doctor will need to examine you). If you need to see the doctor, and your condition is not urgent, you will be asked to see your usual doctor and an appointment will be made for you to see him/her when his/her next routine appointment is available. If, however, you need to see a doctor sooner than your usual doctor's next routine appointment you may be asked to see whichever doctor has the soonest free appointment. If you need urgent medical attention the same day, and there are no free appointments, the receptionists will take your name and a contact number and will ask a doctor to telephone you during their surgery. The doctor can then make arrangements for you to come to the surgery at a mutually convenient time or may be able to give you advice or arrange a prescription for medication over the phone. This procedure is called 'triage'.

Nurse Practitioners

Nurse practitioners are highly trained and experienced nurses who hold a number of advanced nursing qualifications in health care. They can assess, diagnose and treat a wide range of minor ailments (eg tonsillitis, chest infections, cystitis and eye infections). They are able to assess and give urgent treatment for chronic respiratory conditions and give health care advice. They can prescribe when appropriate and will refer patients to another member of the health care team if needed (eg doctor, practice nurse, dietician etc).



Practice Nurse

The practice nurses assist the doctors with patient care. Their duties include giving injections, removal of sutures, cervical smears, ear syringing, annual contraceptive and coil checks, advice on preventing heart disease and general health check-ups etc. When booking an appointment with the practice nurse you will be asked what treatment you are

attending for. This is to help the nurse prepare for your appointment before you arrive.

Health Care Assistants

Our health care assistants assist our practice nurses

and are available every morning and some evenings. Their duties include taking blood samples and blood pressure readings, ECGs etc.

The Healthy Living Area at Brough and South Cave Surgeries

Are you due an MOT?

Why not pay a visit to the Healthy Living Area at the Brough Surgery and have a Do-It-Yourself MOT. Here you can check your height, weight and blood pressure. We also have various resources available including leaflets covering healthy eating, food labelling, high blood pressure and much more. Fill in one of the DIY MOT cards provided and then hand it in at reception. The information will be reviewed and if necessary you will be called in for a review.
