

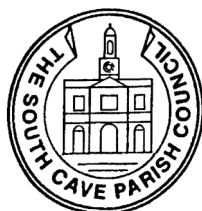

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

FROM THE CHAIR

Welcome to our newsletter for October/November and I would like to take this opportunity to summarise our accounts for the half-year ended 30th September.

Income for the period amounted to £103,359 against a budget of £101,428. The excess was principally the donation of £1,250 received from SCAR.

Expenditure for the period amounted to £52,792 against a budget of £54,812 producing a saving of £2,020. This was basically due to savings in administration in running the office and Town Hall.

We have during this time also completed various works, which have been paid for from reserves.

These include: - Repairs to the Cemetery Wall and Chapel	£12,207
Town Hall Meeting Room	2,464
War Memorial	750
Village Entrance Signs	3,275

U3A, who are regular users of our Meeting Room, have since made a generous contribution to the Meeting Room costs above for which we are very grateful.

The Village Entrance Signs referred to above, are still awaiting erection due to delays caused by East Riding Council, but we have now had full clearance and they will be in position shortly

You will be aware that Council has consulted a firm of solicitors concerning proposals to develop land on Little Wold Lane. We have been advised that, due to time lapsed since the original decision to allocate the plot, a challenge could not be mounted. However, we are advised that in the event of a large scale planning application, the comprehensive objections we have compiled are valid and have some weight. As yet, no application has been made but as soon as we have further information, we will act accordingly.

The original Consultation Document for the revised Local Development Framework, which included the proposal for such a scheme, is currently going through a review process with East Riding Council. We intend to work closely with ERYC and maintain regular pro-active consultation with them on this matter. They are under no illusion that both Council and the Community of South Cave have grave concerns about such a scheme.

We will ensure that you are kept up to date with the matter.

Everyone has seen it and many of you reading this will have been there or sent your children and even your grandchildren there. It's been putting a smile on the faces of children since 1969 and South Cave Play Group and Preschool is still going from strength to strength.

When it opened in 1969 the Play Group was just that, a play group for mums and children to meet and play. 42 years on and it is a very different place, with a coveted 'good' rating from OFSTED the Play Group and Preschool provides a top class standard of early years education for children aged from 2 1/2 right through to their preschool term.

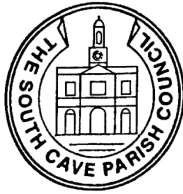
