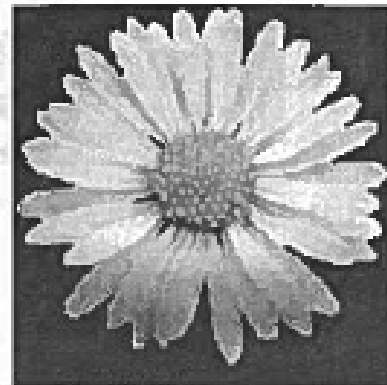

## What is the Daisy Appeal?

The Daisy Appeal is a local charity established to help improve treatment and research opportunities in a variety of common diseases, most notably cancer and heart disease.

Having successfully raised £8 million to enable



the construction of a Medical Research Centre at Castle Hill Hospital in 2008, the Daisy Appeal has now moved onto Phase 2 of the Appeal and is looking to raise a further £6.6 million to purchase PET-CT Scanning equipment. The Cyclotron will be housed in a purpose built facility at Castle Hill Hospital. This will provide a unique way of delivering top class scanning to the community

Research and treatment facilities for people in the Hull & East Yorkshire region are now greatly improved and with the addition of this equipment, we will be the first in Yorkshire to provide advanced imaging facilities directly linked to an ongoing scientific research programme.

## RSA Transitions – Everthorpe Hall Estate

The RSA (the Royal Society for the encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce) is working with HMP Everthorpe to develop a major resettlement project: Transitions. Since the end of last year the Transitions team has been assessing the potential for bringing Everthorpe Hall, the farm and 45 acres adjacent to the prison back into use as a 'Transitions park', offering employment, skills and resettlement services while benefitting the community.

Surveys have been completed to assess the condition of the site and funds required to take Transitions from the research stage to reality. Everthorpe Hall was originally built in 1871 but has not been in use for 10 years and assessments are ongoing to determine what tasks can be completed by offenders. We are also working with the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust (YWT) on land and habitat surveys.

Between now and mid-Summer we will be working with volunteers to undertake consultation with the local community, prisoners, prison staff, employers and service providers. This will identify gaps in services and activities, the skills that offenders need, and where stronger links between services and different groups are required. This work will help us to pinpoint shared ideas and concerns and focus on areas where Transitions can best add value.

We would like to thank local people who contributed to the history open day which was very valuable in assessing the rich history and level of community interest.
